6. SELLER'S WARRANTIES AND TITLE

The Seller warrants and represents to the Buyer that, as at the date of this Bill of Sale:

- (a) the Seller is the sole legal owner of the Goods and has full right and authority to sell and transfer them;
- (b) the Goods are free from any mortgage, charge, lien, hire-purchase agreement, conditional sale agreement, or other encumbrance;
- (c) the Goods have not been reported stolen and are not subject to any court order restricting their sale; and
- (d) the Seller is not aware of any matter that would prevent the Buyer from obtaining quiet possession of the Goods.

9. REGISTRATION NOTICE

Security Bill of Sale only: If this document secures a loan or debt whilst the grantor retains possession of the goods, it MUST be registered at the High Court of Justice (King's Bench Division) within 7 clear days of execution, accompanied by the original Bill, the Schedule, a true copy of each, and a sworn affidavit. Registration must be renewed every 5 years. Failure to register voids the security (Bills of Sale Act (1878) Amendment Act 1882, s.8).

Motor Vehicle Sales: The Seller must notify the change of keeper to the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency via the V5C logbook within 3 working days of the sale date. The Buyer should retain this Bill of Sale as proof of purchase.
